- The auction list will indicate the estimated price likely to be realised. The actual reserve may be below this and will be the **minimum** price at which the item will be sold.
- Lots will be described (with all noted imperfections) as accurately as possible. Bi-lingual pairs are horizontal unless otherwise stated. Postal queries concerning the Auction or any Lot described must be made by email or accompanied by a return envelope duly stamped (or with an International Reply Coupon).
- Postal Auction bids are to be notified to the Auction Manager using the form provided (preferably listed in numerical lot order) or by email. Telephoned bids may be accepted but must be confirmed in writing or by email. Telephone and email bidders will be presumed to understand and accept the Auction Rules.

Payment by BACS can be made. Payment in English currency is acceptable but sent at the purchaser's risk. Lots may be despatched before payment is made at the discretion of the Auctioneer.

- 13 Overseas Members should make payment, to the Society's Bank Account as notified by the Auctioneer, by International Bank Transfer, or by "TransferWise", or by PayPal (any fees for such service being met by the Purchaser) to the society's auction email account - [sacsauc@btinternet.com](mailto:sacsauc@btinternet.com). Please do not pay the Auctioneer personally - any further details required will be supplied on application to the Auctioneer.
- 14 Postage and Packing is payable by the Purchaser.
- 15 All lots will be despatched at the Purchaser's risk -
- a - If to a total value of less than £75 by normal 2<sup>nd</sup> class post to Purchasers living within the United Kingdom, or by airmail to overseas Purchasers.
  - b - Lots to a total value exceeding £75 will be despatched to a destination within the UK by Signed for Mail.
  - c - Lots to a total value exceeding £75 will be despatched to a destination outside the UK by Tracked and Signed for Mail by ParcelForce. NB overseas purchasers may wish to stipulate alternative arrangements, eg a courier service.
  - d - All lots sent to postal bidders, although covered by the Society's insurers to the value of the sums bid, will be submitted to them at their risk.
- 16 To facilitate customs clearance, appropriate customs form will be used for overseas buyers.
- 17 If a Purchaser requires an invoice sent under separate cover, the Auctioneer should be notified.
- 18 The Auctioneer may bid in any Society Auction, but in the case of a Postal Auction, the Auctioneer shall not bid for any lot for which he has already received a postal bid.
- 19 Commission of 10% is charged to vendors on all lots sold (subject to a minimum commission of 25p). There are no lotting, unsold charges, VAT etc. Vendors will receive payment for sold lots approximately 35 days after the Auction closing date.
- 20 Purchasers will have the right to return material in the event of a misdescription within 21 days of the end of the Auction and receive a refund of the purchase price. However, if the alleged misdescription is in respect of the condition of the material, the Auctioneer will exercise reasonable discretion and, if satisfied that the material was accurately described in the Auction Catalogue, may refuse to refund the purchase price. There will be no right of return in the event that the material and its condition have been correctly described.
- 21 Lots which are not sold may be purchased after the Auction at the reserve price - the first Purchaser to notify his interest to the Auctioneer shall be the purchaser.
- 22 Lots unsold will be offered for sale in a later Auction but at a reserve reduced by approximately 10-15% - if still unsold, they will be offered in a second later Auction at a further reduction. If not sold after being offered 3 times, unsold lots may be amalgamated by the Auctioneer with other unsold lots belonging to the same Vendor or will be returned to the owner by Signed for Post at the owner's expense.
- 23 Any alterations to these Rules will be published in *The Springbok*.
